

Introducing Three New Books about Streets: A Book Signing, Reception, and Discussion



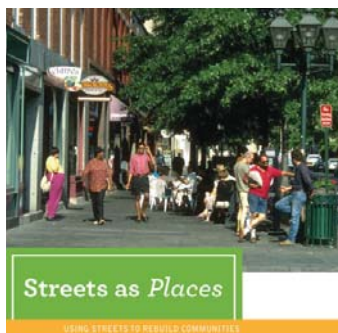
Join **Project for Public Spaces**
